FedNor Investment Supports Infrastructure, Youth and Economic Growth in the Temiskaming Shores Region

Economic Development Initiative Funding

Temiskaming Shores & Area Chamber of Commerce

\$262,000

A FedNor investment of \$262,000 will enable the Temiskaming Shores & Area Chamber of Commerce, in partnership with the City of Temiskaming Shores, Timiskaming First Nation, Collège Boréal and l'Association Canadienne Française de l'Ontario, to increase bilingual tourism and business opportunities in the Temiskaming region. Specifically, the funding will be used to create new tourism products and a database of businesses and services offered in the region, develop a bilingual tourism guide, coordinate and host business and tourism events, as well as implement a bilingual welcoming campaign for the region. This targeted investment is provided through FedNor's Economic Development Initiative (EDI), which is designed to foster innovation, economic diversification and business growth in Northern Ontario's official language minority communities.

Northern Ontario Development Program Funding

City of Temiskaming Shores

\$31,500

To enhance business development and growth in the region, the City of Temiskaming Shores will receive FedNor funding of \$31,500 to hire a youth intern for a one-year period. Working as a Business Development Coordinator for the New Liskeard Business Improvement Area (BIA), the intern will gain valuable work experience performing tasks such as organizing events and activities to boost economic development in the downtown core, establishing a member database, coordinating training opportunities, as well as creating and implementing a marketing strategy on behalf of the BIA members. The funding for this priority project is provided through FedNor's Northern Ontario Development Program, which supports projects that promote sustainable community economic development, enhance business development and growth, and facilitate innovation.

Canada 150 Community Infrastructure Program (CIP 150) Funding

The Canada 150 Community Infrastructure Program is part of the Government of Canada's coordinated approach to mark the anniversary of Confederation. The program will leave a lasting legacy in communities across the country by supporting improvements to community infrastructure that provide community and cultural benefits for the public, including projects that ensure a better future for Aboriginal peoples and promote a clean-growth economy.

Township of Casey

\$25,000

A Canada 150 Community Infrastructure Program investment of \$25,000, through FedNor, will enable the Township of Casey to install permanent and fully accessible washroom facilities at the local arena.

Town of Englehart

\$19,000

The Town of Englehart will receive \$19,000 to complete vital infrastructure improvements to the community's outdoor pool facility. Specifically, funding for this priority project will be used to update shower and washroom facilities, as well as upgrade flooring and repaint the main pool building.

Township of Kerns**\$12,750**

To help celebrate Canada's rich heritage and history, FedNor funding of \$12,750 will enable the Township of Kerns to complete upgrades to its community park. Specifically, this infrastructure investment will be used to rehabilitate and replace out-dated playground equipment to increase safety and the enjoyment for residents throughout the area.

Township of Chamberlain**\$10,654**

An investment of \$10,654 will enable the Township of Chamberlain to modernize its Community Hall. Specifically, this funding will be used to install automatic double doors at the front entrance to make it fully accessible, replace the back entrance, install a monitored door bell system, replace existing windows with energy efficient units and upgrade existing lighting with an LED system.

Municipality of Charlton and Dack**\$3,750**

To assist with the expansion of its municipal marina, the Municipality of Charlton and Dack will receive \$3,750 to complete a dock extension, which includes the construction of four additional boat slips, increasing current dock infrastructure by 50 percent.

Township of Harley**\$2,500**

The Township of Harley will use CIP 150 funding of \$2,500 to help improve aesthetics at the community playground and baseball field by installing two flag poles.
